THE CROSS – A BEACON OF HOPE

In just a few days after you receive this edition of Harvest International's Newsletter many, in most parts of the world, would be marking Good Friday and Easter Sunday - days that commemorate the Crucifixion of our Lord Jesus Christ and His glorious Resurrection three days later.

Undoubtedly, these two days are extremely significant for all of humanity. Many choose to attend a Good Friday service, but others are concerned that the suffering, agony, and inhumanity to which our Lord was subjected are all too often forgotten. Some attempt to re-enact our Lord's experiences on that day by trying to replicate scenes designed to lead followers into feelings of sorrow, pity, or contrition. To them, this is what the Crucifixion is all about – sorrow, sadness, suffering, everything negative and dark. But is it?

In Paul's letter to the Romans, he traversed his way up a very great many things from Adam's first sin, tracing all its consequences through all the generations, up to Christ. Then, he places at the end of all of that, the Cross of the Lord Jesus Christ. From that point, he opens up an entirely new prospect and future – the Cross being the terminal point up to which everything leads, and from which everything takes a new rise. He comes at length to 'The God of Hope' in Rom. 15:13 – "Now, the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope, in the power of the Holy Spirit".

"The God of hope fill you that you may abound in hope!" It is well-nigh impossible to trace the development of the teachings of this great letter and not be faced with a strange paradox through which over the entire course of history God has written the meaning of the Cross - and it is this, the answer of God to sin, evil, disobedience and to all its fruits and results, is travail, despair, and death. But, notwithstanding that, He is the God of Hope and travail. Passion, despair, and death are the only way of Hope.

Let us take a moment to think about that, for this truth is written deeply in the entire history of God's dealings with humanity. The Cross has been implicit in all His dealings with man and, not only in general, but particularly with His own people.

For if God really cares about His people and His thoughts toward us are good (and they undoubtedly are) this is the only way to find meaning and purpose in everything He allows His children to go through. For, He always has in view His eternal purposes for mankind, and from that, He never deviates. And this is our hope! Morbid? Depressing? Read Romans again.

Late last year, many of you joined in with several others in praying for God's healing for Dhan as he underwent surgery for a spinal decompression. He has never had that pain again, praise God. However, on February 11th, he tripped at a Church break-fast while rising from his chair. Thank God, he does not seem to have sustained any damaged bones but the muscles in his left leg – from hip to knee – became swollen and quite painful. He's been having twice-weekly physio sessions with some success, but it seems to be a longer process than anticipated. He struggled a bit to find context for this accident, and here it is – the Cross.

Our hearts overflowed with joy and gratitude – Joy at this fine gesture, the first such blessing received from one of our disciples in almost fifteen years here; and gratitude for the thought, the abundance which he bestowed upon us, and the length to which he went to bring them to us. Yes, God is good!



February 2023

Dear Partnering Friends,

We trust that 2023 has begun well for you and pray that as the days roll on, may we all grow in total abandonment, trusting our resurrected Lord as our Sufficiency, our Victory, our Sustenance, and our Rest. The days of Covid lockdown are over but the memories of those days still linger on, even as some of the symptoms and positive cases of the virus continue to make their appearance, not only here but also in other parts of the world. May the lessons which we learnt from those three years continue to grow and develop in us so that our faith becomes purer, and our lives more firmly rooted in Him.

We have many memories from this past year. Our most severe challenges included Dolly's bout of Covid pneumonia in January and Dhan's back problem which manifested itself during most of the year with growing pains down both legs. After consultations with two specialists in the field and many sessions with physiotherapists, convinced that the only certain route was the Lord's will, He showed us that He wanted us to agree on the less invasive surgical intervention. Dhan testifies that, not for one moment since the day of the surgery on October 21, has he experienced those gnawing pains again. *Oh, the goodness of our Father!* Knowing that many of you were praying for us certainly buoyed us up during that time, and we are so very grateful to all of you who surrounded us with your prayers. This is a very memorable experience which we can never forget.

Since the first lockdown here, we have not travelled out to our groups. Instead, we have met **exclusively with individuals and groups here in Harare, or via What's App (WAP) and Zoom. This** worked well except for those who had no access to the internet and using their phone packages would involve increased costs. Despite our own challenges, however, the Lord led us last August to organize a Retreat with some of the key leaders with whom we had been meeting. It was such a time of refreshing for all of us. Since then, we have been meeting on WAP with participants from which some lively discussions have ensued. Recently, the Lord has again laid it on our hearts to bring these men together for a follow-up Retreat. So, we are agreed on Saturday 18 and Sunday 19th February – only two weeks away!

Eleven participants are expected, seven of whom are from remote areas. They will be overnighting. The rest are from Harare. The venue has already been secured and we are all excited about meeting again. Please join us in praying for this event – for each attendee, prepared hearts, for reliable and safe transportation for attendees; for Dhan's heart as he prepares to share and for the preparation of meals, etc.

We are also contemplating a furlough this year. Additionally, a special niece of Dhan's will be getting married on April 7th and we would really like to attend as well as sort out some personal issues back home, that need our attention. However, there are some hindrances – first Dolly's US visa has expired and although she applied for renewal since 2021, and two weeks ago she was allowed to visit the Embassy to pay the fee, there are some hiccups regarding the prepaid receipt and return envelope sent to the Embassy by the Couriers. Please pray that this gets resolved soon so the passport could be returned to us. Also, up for renewal is our Temporary Residence Permit (TEP) for Zimbabwe which expires next month. The application for renewal has been sent in. Please pray that the renewed permit would soon be issued.

Thank you so much for partnering with us in this ministry and for your faithful prayers for us and the work here.

He made it to Harare; made contact with Joyson, who was helping us ferry people from the City to the venue, and arrived at the Retreat venue just as we were about to start. The poor guy turned down breakfast, placed his bag in his room and went straight into the morning session. He was so happy that he had made it! We were too. He was attentive throughout the event and his participation was priceless.

Christmas greetings to you! While many of you are trying to keep warm, we in Zimbabwe are battling with temperatures of 87 to 105.8F. Whatever our climatic or personal challenges, we thank God for the privilege that we as believers have to remember, marvel at and celebrate, with deepest meaning, the coming into this world of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Indeed, " unto us, a Child is born, unto us a Son is given". He is God's incredible Gift to mankind! May this truth not be minimized as we celebrate.

The question has been asked, how do folks celebrate Christmas in Zimbabwe? Well, culturally, it is a family time. So, most businesses begin to close by the 15th of December and reopen the first week of January. This gives employees a chance to travel to their family homes (their Kumusha) for the holiday and be back to work in January. Non-indigenous folk would generally travel abroad or go to the local lakes, safari lodges or other holiday resorts. Few of the more affluent folk celebrate Christmas at home.

Some of the City churches sing carols on the Sundays preceding Christmas, have a candlelight service during Christmas week as well as a Christmas morning service. Some private schools have Christmas programs or allow their premises to be used for Christmas plays. Many of the shops also play Christmas carols. Few trees graced our local shopping areas this year, no doubt due to the increased power cuts.



Last week, we had the privilege of visiting Georgina, one of our young missionary friends, who has recently moved into a two-bedroomed traditional roundhouse which she has been building in phases, as finances allowed. There is still a lot to be done. But despite the many challenges she has faced as a single woman building in a male-dominated society, she is unfazed. Georgina gets water from neigh-

bors and uses a single solar lamp for lighting, but she is totally at peace and thankful to God for His provision. She has named her little house "Bethel" – God's lighthouse in a community that is riddled with syncretism, witchcraft, ancestral worship, and the like. Few in the community would guess that this young lady has a master's degree, speaks 7 languages, interprets at international conferences for her mission's organization, and holds a responsible position at their offices in Harare. We thank our Lord for her love and commitment to Him who 2000 years ago, left the splendor of heaven to come and live among us so He could reveal the Father to us that we might have eternal life.

REJOICE WITH US! Even as we end this letter, our Heavenly Father is showering His blessings on us with the first long-awaited rain shower! How much we pray for more!!

May we all celebrate Jesus, the Gift of God, with thanksgiving in our hearts this Christmas and always.
