

The Schmidts in HAITI



I just returned from two weeks in Haiti, aiding in the Earthquake Relief efforts and evaluating how Harvest International can help respond to the great reconstruction needs of the people's lives and livelihood. I saw the Lord's hand from the way I was able to get into Haiti so quickly and the provision of a place to stay while there.



The devastation was shocking to see. Most people lost some family member and are now living outside in sheet "tents" because they have lost their home or fear aftershocks. From the moment I arrived I was commissioned to transport the severly injured from mobile clinics to "field" hospitals, and take treated patients to rehab facilities. I was also able to help in reconstruction efforts; getting water, food and tents to refugees living in "tent cities". Ond day I went to the outlying areas where Harvest International has works to check on how they were doing and the refugees they were caring for.

We feel God is calling our family to Haiti to manage long term relief efforts through food distributions, medical and reconstruction teams to rebuild schools, churches, orphanages; along with meeting the great spiritual

needs of the people, as the Lord directs.

Our family's vision has always been for the physically and spiritually needy children of Haiti. Now this need includes a vast number of children with amputated limbs. This is a dire need, the situation is desperate; the handicapped in Haiti are left to fend for themselves with little hope of survival.





Our hearts' desire is to have a home for these children where they will be cared for in the name of Jesus Christ; receive a Bible-based education, as well as physical therapy and occupational therapy, teaching them skills to be godly, contributing citizens of Haiti.

We cannot do this without the help of churches and individuals supporting this vision. Our goal is to get our family to Haiti within six months to secure a facility and begin meeting these needs. Twenty-five years ago this month Tom went to Haiti for the first time and we got the call to serve the Lord there. Since the Jananuary 12, 2010 earthquake, the Lord has given us a burden for newly orphaned amputees. There are thousands of children who will be cast out on the streets to fend for themselves because of their handicaps.

Our vision is to start a Christ Centered Family Home for these children; teaching them to live for the glory of God and be contributing members of their society. With God's help we will give them a Christian Education, Physical and Occupational Therapy, needed medical treatment and a profession to support themselves in the future. What a privilege it is to serve our Lord and Savior in this way!

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore will not we fear, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea; Though the waters thereof roar and be troubled, though the mountains shake with the swelling thereof. Selah." ~ Psalm 46:1-3

We are excited about an opportunity that the Lord has put in our path. An organization/donor has offered to supply an orphanage facility at very little cost to us if we can find an adequate piece of property, (to lease or buy), to place it on.

We ask you to prayerfully consider if the Lord might have you, in some way, help with any of these needs. We will also be hosting teams, receiving containers of medical and humanitarian aide for earthquake victims, guiding National pastors works in-country, as well as supervising clean-up and reconstruction workers.

Over the next few weeks we will be visiting churches, sharing our vision, looking for partners in prayer and financial support. We have already received pledges for about 1/3 of our support needs, we have a buyer for our home in Florida and things seem to be right on target for our goal of moving to Haiti in June.

Please pray for us as we desire to be ministers of salt and light in a dark world. This is the verse the Lord gave us 25 years ago and He is still exhorting us to live by it today.

The Schmidts April 2010 in HAITI



April 1st -14th marked my third trip into Haiti since the earthquake, and the rainy season has started! All the tent cities are still in place. The sheets that were first put up are now covered with tarps or replaced with tents covered with tarps. Some humanitarian organizations have built or set up port-a-potties and bathing stalls in the tent cities. I did see some

schools starting up again, with most, if not all, schools meeting outside under trees or tarps. Most of the people and students still refuse to go into any buildings with cement roofs.





This trip was made to host 50 people coming in for teams to: Cayes, Gonaives, and Port-au-Prince. Arranging for transportatioin for all these people and their luggage was quite a challenge, but ... the Lord provided. Our team of 21 stayed in PAP and camped out in tents (on cots) for the men with the 10 ladies bunking in one room. The rains began our third night, which made for "damp" sleeping and puddle jumping the rest of our stay.

I stayed three days after the team left to look at places for our family to live and start our ministry in the Port-au-Prince area. The most promising is north of PAP with a water source, small house, start of a church/school building and a walled-in yard. Please pray that we can raise the ministry funds to rent/own this property as it has been made available to us at a fair price. We are on schedule to be able to move to Haiti in June to start Shiloh Children's Home/Christian School and Church! Praise the Lord!

Every time I go to Haiti I am approached by people and asked to meet the desperate needs of these young victims of the Jan 2010 Earthquake. The need is so very great, this is the reason we want to get down there as soon as possible.

Life in Haiti is so different from the states. The weather is very hot, work is hard and communication with the outside world is very challenging. Even though there are struggles, the people are very special and the need is great. At present we have received our containers that were held up in customs for a couple of weeks. We now have clothing to give out, food for our family & to share with the needy, and our school books! Praise the Lord!

We were able to get our 1985 Preparing to put up 3 donated pre-fab buildings to house children until we can raise funds to build a cement building, Lord willing in the next 2 yrs. Our sons, Benjamin and Matthew along with a young man from SC will be helping us build these in mid-August.

- We have cleared a site for the Fish ponds and have some of the plumbing ready for that project
- We have heard of children needing a permanent Christian Home: to be loved, cared for, rehabilitated and educated. Plan to visit them and search for others in mid-August.
- . Got our 3 D-containers out of customs. Nearly 3,000 lbs. of food, clothing, school books, ect. Now we have suplies to give to needy families.
- Tom has been to see the Head of Bien et Social who licenses Children's Homes/Orphanages and we will soon be licensed!
- We have been given recommendations for House Mother's: will be interviewing them soon.
- We have a group coming in early Sept. to build bunk beds for the children and paint the insides of the buildings. By mid-Sept. we should be ready for the children!!

Immediate Needs

As we get ready for the children we'll be caring for in our Children's Home, we have some immediate needs. We expect to be getting children in September and will need clothing, bedding and school supplies ready for them.

SPONSORSHIP Program: Each child we get will need to be sponsored. This will cover the expense of running the home and school for the children. Based on costs according to current prices in Haiti, we believe \$60/month/child will cover this need.

CLOTHING: Because we want the children to dress modestly and uniformly to avoid peer pressure issues, we need specific clothes bought and/or made. We have made a careful estimate of \$80/child/6-12mos (not yet sure of wear & tear in this climate). This includes underclothing, clothes for school, play, church and sleeping. We have some young ladies from our church and a few others that are willing to sew jumpers for the girls. Some clothes that are needed might even be on sale at this time! BEDDING: We also have an immediate need for sheet sets and light weight quilts.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: Updated world globe and map, pens, pencils, notebooks, scissors, glue, etc.

Our 2 Year Plan

Our 2-year plan includes the buying of this property, for \$75,000. We'd like to start a fund for that immediately, because we can't build a permanent structure until the property is in the ministry name. Then we will raise the money for our building where we plan to have the Church/School on the 1st level, the Children's Home on the 2nd level, and the family apartment on the 3rd level.

Our Goal

There are many children who have lost a limb due to the Jan. 2010 Earthquake, and not many places available to rehabilitate them. This breaks our hearts as we know with the proper care and training they can become useful, contributing citizens even in this difficult country. Our goal is to share the love of Christ with them, teach them skills to be able to support their family someday and change the mind set of Haiti concerning handicapped people! We know this is of the Lord and look forward to how He will make it all become reality. What a privilege it is to serve our Lord and Savior in this way! Isn't that just like the Lord, providing for our needs even before we have them!

• Praising the Lord for our son, Benjamin, who spent three months down here helping with all the set-up work and expenses. SHILOH CHILDREN'S HOME The Schmidt Family in Haiti November 2010

"And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men. ~ Colossians 3:23 ~

We are excited to introduce to you Shiloh Children's Home first residents!! Jason Littillo Innocent and Caleb Vladimir Innocent. They are not brothers in the normal sense, only by the bond of similar circumstances. They were both left (abandoned) in the courtyard at Grace Children's Hospital. Their middle names indicate the person who found them, their last names were given to them by the hospital where they've been living for over a year, and 6 months respectively. We gave them their first names.



Jason is about five years old yet cannot walk or talk. He can pull himself up in his crib and loves to play with us. He is able to eat normally and even feed himself small pieces of food. He loves to eat everything and is learning to drink from a drink bottle (we'll work on a cup later). He seems to have a lot of potential and we expect he will be able to walk & maybe talk someday. God only knows what lies ahead for him. With Jesus as our guide we intend to do everything we can to help him become all he was created to be.



Caleb is approximately four years old and has some more severe issues. He cannot walk or sit up. He has medication for seizures and at first we thought maybe he was deaf and blind. But after a medical group came to evaluate both children, they believe most of his problems are seizure related, including possible brain damage. Because he was dropped off at the hospital after the earthquake, it is possible some of his problems are due to trauma/injury during that time. We plan to have a doctor give us a full evaluation, to make sure we can keep him here. If he needs nurses' care we may not be able to provide that,

but we don't want to see him go to a place where they will not work with him. We don't know what the Lord's plan is for this little guy, but we do know all things are possible with Him. We want to give him the love and care he needs knowing God will do the rest. He is a precious little one. Please pray with us for him.

There is also a one year old, boy, that has some handicap, don't know what yet. He was thrown in a garbage pile, his parents didn't want him, or were afraid they couldn't care for them. He was rescued by a Haitian pastor's daughter, but she can no longer take care of him, as she was given a job to help her family survive. We've been asked to take him, so we will go look at him soon, Lord willing.











Our heart's desire is still to work with children who have lost a limb in the January earthquake and we would appreciate your prayers concerning this. The Director at Grace Children's Hospital told us there are plenty in the area. One of the problems is that many of the Haitian people are now afraid to trust the white people with their children because of the group who tried to get orphans out of Haiti illegally through the Dominican Republic just after the earthquake. We are starting to develop a relationship with Grace Children's Hospital and they in turn will help us develop a relationship with some of the earthquake amputee families. This will take some time, but we know that the Lord's timing is perfect. We don't want to take the children from their families, our only desire is to teach them about Jesus and then give them a skill they can use in the future. If they have a home to go to on weekends, we would love to be able to have them do that.

A mother's job in Haiti includes hauling water to wash clothes by hand and for bathing the children; cleaning the house totally each day to keep bugs to a minimum; sweeping their dirt yard, making a meal for the family (no fast foods here), walking miles to market to sell or buy. Their day is long and full. When they have a handicapped child it can take all of their time to care for that one child. It is no wonder so many are found in garbage piles or abandoned at churches or hospitals. We are looking for sponsors for the children and nannies we will need to help us care for these precious ones.

We are also reevaluating the suitability of this property in light of the fact that the new law is to only have one story buildings for schools, churches and orphanages. The property we are renting is not very large, but it would have been adequate if we could have built a three story building. We are prayerfully considering seeking some other possibilities with more land.
