Today, we are writing from Dominica where we are visiting our daughter and her family and friends and waiting for Dolly's new passport. We return to Grenada on the 24th for a month where we have two speaking engagements at Missions Conferences, then back to Florida (Ocala), Pennsylvania and New York in the Fall for another three Conferences (Dhan will speak at two) before returning to Grenada at the end of October, and back to Zimbabwe in January.

Over the last few weeks, we have had the extreme pleasure of seeing several of you, and getting "welcome back" hugs. We also had the privilege of sharing with many, in church buildings and homes, individually and in group settings, sometimes over a meal and often late into the evening hours. Our first stop was London, then Florida (Miami, Ft Lauderdale, Ocala, Gainesville), Texas, Nebraska and Kansas (Elbing, Burrton, Newton). In some cases, we met with past missionary colleagues, former pastors, their children and grands. What a joy that was. We had not seen many of them since 1986 but we share many precious memories, including Dhan's conversion and early spiritual growth. Thanks for making all of this possible, for your warm welcome and for the implicit yet powerful reminders that you are indeed a vital part of our ministry.

As you can imagine, we have already slept in many beds and packed and unpacked dozens of times during the past two months. Throughout, we have been the beneficiaries of the kindness and gracious hospitality of many who, with love and goodwill, bravely put up with our many movements, entrances and exits, and coped with the resulting uncertainties in their schedules. You would have seen on the news that the Zimbabwe elections were held on July 31 and, from all accounts, it was relatively peaceful. However, we ask that you continue to pray for the Country - particularly, that out of this, the Church would grow and be strengthened, and that the Lord's people would display great maturity as they honor Him in their lives.

Several of you have also joined us in praying for our sister-in-law, Valda, who had surgery in June to remove a mass on her brain. The surgery was a great success but unfortunately the pituitary could not be saved. We are happy to report that the doctors are pleased that she continues to make very good progress. She has one final doctor's visit before returning to Grenada on the 18th. We appreciate your standing with us; thank God for His mercies and pray that she would enjoy good health as she learns to live on hormone replacements.

Dear Friends,

The past four weeks have certainly been different for us. After meeting with only one group, we postponed all other classes. Being at home gave us the opportunity to catch up on some work, including stuff we had not been able to schedule for years. So we made good use of the time, for which we thank the Lord. We are arranging to resume meeting with each of the five groups starting in another couple weeks.

This month marks the fifth anniversary of the grant of our first permit to carry on the work which the Lord assigned us. We were advised that at the end of five years, no further work permits are granted; that one would either leave the Country or apply for a residence permit. We opted for the latter, not being persuaded that the Lord had indicated that we should leave; but we did wonder what the outcome would be. However, we could hardly believe it when, within two weeks, we were granted a two-year permit! So, we praise God for this and can now approach the next two years with a good measure of clarity and confidence. Join us in praising His holy Name!

As you would recall from our letters of several months now, we have been considering a furlough this year, and had been asking that you pray with us in this regard. We have three reasons for desiring a furlough – first, to report to you our partnering friends and to encourage you to continue your involvement in world missions; also, to see and spend some time with our children (two girls) and our grands (two girls and three boys); and thirdly, to visit our siblings. Our two grand-daughters will be sixteen and fourteen this year and we really feel the need to have an input, albeit limited, in their lives. In order to accomplish all of this without being exhausted at the end, we feel we ought to use the rest of the year from May.

We have finalized most of our itinerary and want to keep you informed of our plans. We leave Zim on Monday May 20th, spend the next week in London, then fly onto Miami where we will be based for a few weeks. We are also planning, however, to visit the Ocala/Gainesville areas in June, and Texas, Nebraska and Kansas in July. A visit to Dominica is scheduled for July/August before we fly to Grenada where we plan to be during September, some of October and the rest of the year. We are attaching a copy of our itinerary for your information and prayer. Since we do not yet have a US cell # you may contact us via email, or at our Head Office (1-352-622-1818) while we are in the US.

The Lord continues to amaze us by how He has gone before us to make preparations for this trip. Earlier this year, we asked Him if He would provide us with a car and accommodation while in Miami, as well as a place to stay in London. We prayed specifically about these matters, mentioned them to no one else, and left them in His hands. A few evenings ago, we received an email from our head office saying that a friend from Pennsylvania had been trying to reach us to let us know he was leaving a car in Miami for our use. Another friend in Miami contacted us saying, "You know you're always welcome to stay with us...." Friends from Grenada living within walking distance of one of Dhan's sisters, informed us that we could stay with them while in London. Wow isn't our Father just wonderful? Do we hear a chorus of praise, in unison with us, to Him?

There is much to be done between now and May 20, and we ask for your prayers for this too. Please also remember to pray that God would meet our every need during the furlough. Above all, we believe this is part of the spiritual journey on which the Lord is taking us so, we not only appreciate your prayers, Friend; we are counting on them. Thanks for your love and friendship, and for your faithfulness to the Lord. Blessings.

Now that we have completed our international visits, we are in Grenada where the Lord has been opening up many opportunities on Sundays as well as weekdays. This will be our first Christmas in Grenada after several years and we look forward to this family time.

While we have not always enjoyed the multiple instances of packing and unpacking, of hurrying to catch flights, or waiting for those that were delayed, nor the often demeaning airport security drills, this furlough has been a wonderful experience for us. We have enjoyed the many demonstrations of God's goodness, in so many ways! To all of you whom He has used to bless us, we say thanks.

We are scheduled to fly out of Miami on Saturday, January 11th to begin our trek back to Zimbabwe where we arrive on the afternoon of Monday 13th.

As we look forward to returning to and resuming the work which began five and a half years ago, we ask that you continue to pray for us – for the remainder of our time on this side; preparations for leaving; readjusting to life in Zim; for continued good health and strength for the work and, most of all, for a deepening sense of need for the Lord in this mission.

It is His work and it is "He who works in us, both to will and to do of His good pleasure" (Phil. 2:13). Please pray for an abundance of grace for us to trust Him to do it through us, for His glory, and for much lasting fruit.

We thank God for you and your labor with us. May He bless you abundantly.
