Our mission is to establish relationships with unchurched students and invite them to a dinner where we all prepare meals from their culture. We invite them to have their loved ones to facetime with us to make sure we prepare the meal correctly. We also want to have the students' family comfortable with their child being around our family.

In the few months we previously spent in Hungary we had the pleasure of hosting dozens of students from: India, Iran, Germany, Russia, Nigeria, Azerbaijan, US, and Hungary. They were all looking forward to continuing to meet.

We will offer the new student friends a free course in English as a second language. The introductory course is John's Gospel with the advanced course being, Mere Christianity By C. S. Lewis. We will have events in and around Budapest the students will be invited to be involved in to build cross cultural deep relationships.

We do street ministry and serve in various ways with each of these ministries. They are trustworthy ministries that a young Christian would grow in their faith while participating with our group.

We intend to have a young couple join us who already have residence. Being established in Budapest with residence permits is huge and overcomes a year of cultural adjustments that often never make it. Our goal is to have them free us up to add universities as our time enables. Their initial roles would be to handle the communications, scheduling of activities, and teach the English as a Second Language course. As soon as a student becomes a Believer they will be discipled using the same tools that we used to bring them to Christ. They will engage in street ministry and be baptized at one of the ministries we serve.

There were no other tables available, so I started putting my coat on to leave when an English speaking Hungarian asked me to join him. Gaspar is a Hungarian Military officer. He asked if Selena and I would begin a Bible study after the beginning of the new year.

Two days ago Selena, Olison and I were in the lobby of our hotel having our morning devotional during breakfast. Another guest came over and asked if we were reading God's word and could she join us? Her name is Farrah and she teaches women in a Bible college in Pakistan. I am using their names and location because they live very public lives and said we should. Her husband Nadeem, is pastor at a Calvary Chapel church in the Punjab state Pakistan. They were raised in the same state and came to know Christ as young adults in college. The church they pastor is fairly large at forty five small families. Needless to say if you're a Christian in this region you experience harsh treatment regularly. Farrah shared, women would never go shopping alone, sex crimes are common by certain groups of Muslims against Christian's confident their crimes will not be prosecuted.



We took them to dinner that night and are spending a few hours showing them around Budapest tomorrow. Nadeem was here meeting with The Reformed Bible Society helping their efforts as they send the Word into the Asian world. He is actively translating classic Christian reference material into Urdu. A number of times a week he ministers via Skype teaching Christian apologetics to converts and those hungering to know more about Christ. Their small church with all of the daily challenges has outreach ministries to the Brick Christians of Pakistan and the Hindu of the desert country. We are sowing into this little band of believers and invite you to pray with us for the living active persecuted body of our Savior Yahweh in Pakistan!

We have not grown tired of the hotel room but now we rejoice knowing we would never have met this wonderful family if we had moved on. We have two leases we are having presented to have our long term housing secured.
