When we first arrived in Zimbabwe almost fourteen years ago, we were totally convinced the Lord had sent us here to help believers grow in their relationship with the Lord. We set out doing this, first, in the capital city, Harare, and later in smaller cities. In each case, we met in groups with Pastors and Church leaders, teaching, discussing, encouraging. Since the onset of the Covid pandemic, however, we now rarely travel out of Harare. Instead, from our home, we meet online with individuals and groups weekly. Last week, we started a new in-person group. Our goal is the same as before – we grow, together and individually, to maturity in our relationship with the Lord. We also continue to meet with individuals at our home over morning coffee, afternoon tea or lunch for teaching and/or mutual encouragement in the faith.

Having had Covid, we were reflecting on the fact that one of the worst things persons recovering from it can do is to measure their recovery progress on a day-to-day basis as this often results in doubt, frustration and despair. The same is true of the work God has called us to - success can only be measured by the level of our faithfulness to God's call. The rest must be left to His Sovereign will.

However, we rejoice and give thanks to Him for those "Timothies" who over the past few months have called, emailed, or visited and expressed their thankfulness for how God has helped them through this ministry.

Sometimes, it seems difficult to believe that God is indeed working out His purposes as they apply to us. As the war in Ukraine escalates and Covid seems to be making a rebound, we must remind ourselves of who He is and who we are in Him; and find our rest in Him alone.

You might ask, 'Why is that so important?' Well, for one thing, much of the New Testament is taken up with this very attitude. For example, in the letter to the Hebrews, the writer repeatedly encourages the reader, "Let us go on". Secondly, we are convinced that the degree of our effectiveness and fruitfulness, individually and collectively, will be determined by the degree of our pursuit of a vibrant and dynamic relationship with the Lord. There is no other way to be able to cope with the increasingly trying times that are upon us or are yet to come.

Dear Friends, please pray with us as we meet with these individuals and groups, as we encourage each other through the pages of Holy Scripture, "and all the more as we see the day approaching." (Hebrews 10:35).

Beloved,

Yes, you haven't heard from us since November. In our last letter to you, we commented that these were very challenging times for everyone, that we must be prepared for what is yet to come, and that only a dynamic relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ will see us through. This does not suggest that we are like pawns on a giant chessboard waiting for the next player's move. We know that the Lord is sovereignly working out His purposes for the entire universe and for us, not as mere innocent bystanders but as active participants in this drama called Life.

This last Christmas was very different for us. Although two children of neighboring friends helped in mounting and decorating our tree, we hardly turned on the lights after Christmas Day. The excitement of past years just wasn't there. Perhaps it's more than our age; our focus has shifted. Beyond the tinsel, lights and gifts, we wanted to celebrate Christmas as God bringing to humanity the greatest revelation of all time - His own Son, ('God in a human body' (Col. 2:9, NLT)), to live among us and to reveal the Father and His purposes to us (Heb. 1:1-3). We are gripped by this profound Truth and its significance to us today. Because Christ came to earth as a man, we who know Him as our Lord and Savior, can find meaning and have hope regardless of the circumstances.

This year began with a test of whether we really believed that. On January 5th, Dolly fell ill. Within two hours, she moved from being fine, to not feeling well, to shivering with a very high fever. It was quite a night. The following day she seemed fine and tested negative for COVID. On the 7th, we called in the Doctor who immediately diagnosed her as having Pneumonia. He began a combo of aggressive treatment and frequent blood tests. She was very ill but within a few days, the Lord brought her through the worst. Now, her only lingering problem is her tendency to sudden dips in her energy. Praise God she is gradually overcoming this by exercise and drinking lots of fluids. But she was very ill.

Meanwhile, in December, I had been diagnosed with a pinched nerve in my lower back. Because of Dolly's illness, I had to put my own treatment on hold. I am consulting a neurosurgeon (a delightful young man who loves the Lord). We are agreed on avoiding surgery by other interventions. So, I am being gradually helped by twice-weekly physio and pain killers when necessary.

In just five months, I twice witnessed the Lord bring Dolly back. We thank God for His mercies towards us and, by His grace, we believe He is working out His larger purposes for us. Our Lord is worthy of all praise!

So far this year, sluggishness has characterized the ministry. For one thing, there were our illnesses, and then the lethargy brought on by the pandemic. The main group who had shown so much promise and into whom we had been pouring much, have been caught between going back to the "same old, same old" of which they had complained when they first invited us to share with them. Our goal was the same as with other groups - to help them grow in their relationship with the Lord.

We know you and several others from so many countries have been praying for us when you were mostly in the dark about our circumstances. We are privileged to have been the subject of your prayers and are deeply grateful for this. Please continue to remember us as you intercede.

We also remember you in our prayers and give thanks for your faithfulness in your support for the ministry.

May He who is faithful continue to supply all your needs and those of your loved ones and bless you with every spiritual blessing in Christ Jesus.

Many believers feel intimidated at sharing the Gospel message in a formal setting but will give of their time to reach out with the love of God in their communities and beyond in practical ways. Most of these folks have themselves suffered great losses, yet they reach out to others at great personal cost. Indeed, we are blessed to be part of the Body of Christ and to experience His love and the joy of fellowshipping with Him and His people.

Let us continue to pray for and encourage each other in our walk with Him. Times are hard, but our Lord is faithful and can be trusted to carry us through the toughest of seasons. Lam 3:22-23.

There are many lessons to be learnt from nature, one of them being the seasons. Wherever we are, seasons exist. In some countries, the seasons are more distinct than in others, but they are still there.

Here in Zimbabwe, all of Africa is north of us except South Africa. We have only two distinct seasons, the dry season, winter and the rainy season or summer. Winter, around May to August, can be quite cold. White potatoes and wheat prevail then but must be irrigated. During the summer, the Country receives most of its rainfall supplied mostly by the Indian Ocean cyclones. Some crops, for example maize, soya, sorghum, and tobacco are grown in the summer. It is not unusual for the rains to be minimal or delayed. Sometimes, there can also be quite a lapse between the changing seasons often resulting in drought.

Another feature here is the changing landscape. Every season brings with it a variety of flowering trees and shrubs. For example, as winter fades, a local shade tree, the msasa, drops all its leaves (some call it Fall) and almost immediately begins to sprout new leaves in various hues of red/orange/rust/tan etc. This lasts but a few days until it is replaced by new leaves in tender shades of green. The blue/purple jacaranda appears before long and sheds its flowers on the street, sidewalk, or yard beneath. What sights to behold!

Isn't natural life like that too? Every stage has its own distinctive features – turning, creeping, walking, teething, growing into adulthood, getting into midlife, becoming seniors, and so on. Some phases are characterized by the need for help, others by an independent streak. But they all go to make up a life.

So too is spiritual life. We may recall our beginning often marked by uncertainty, sometimes doubt, and our need for reassurance. Then we embarked on what is usually called the Christian life – participation in a local church and its activities, self-confidence, busyness, perhaps years in some form of well-intentioned ministry. It is then we might begin to sense a shallowness in our relationship with the Lord and might ask ourselves: 'Is this all?', 'Have I been on the right track?', 'Has it been worthwhile?'. Then perhaps fear that we had been walking in only the shadow of something far more real and greater than we had experienced grips us as we contemplate the approaching dim light of the evening of our days here on earth.

In the Lord's grace, we begin to see our Lord Jesus Christ as the Reality of our salvation and wish we had more time to explore the depth of His riches which, sadly, were missed during most of our Christian life. We read again Colossians 2:9, 10 from the New Living Translation – "For in Christ lives all the fullness of God in a human body. So, you are complete through your union with Christ...." Other passages of Scripture lead us to conclude, 'Yes, that's what it's about Christ!', for "He is the sum of all things"; and the kind of Christians we are and the measure of His fullness in us will be determined exclusively by our knowledge of Him. As we contemplate further, perhaps we reflect on how we might be eulogized by our loved ones and we fear they might just present a brighter picture of our walk with the Lord than it really was.

This was our motivation when we hosted a four-day Retreat last month for nine persons some of whom we had been meeting with face-to-face, pre-Covid. This, together with our continuing online group meetings, has been the highlight of our last three years here. Not only was there good participation, but we are excited by the level of discussion via What's App that has followed.

To those of you who have been a part of this ministry, we thank God for you and your faithfulness. May He continue to provide all your needs – spiritual and physical – and may we daily grow in appreciation of His abundant grace towards us. Let us hold on to that grace so that we will appropriate all that He has purposed for us, His children. And may we, unashamedly, cry out to Him that He might grant us a clearer vision of Who He really is. This might just be one of the most meaningful seasons of our lives!

July 2022

Firstly, we want to thank you for your faithfulness in partnering with us in the ministry to which the Lord has called us here in Zimbabwe since June 2008. In fact, several of you have been supporting us since the 1980's when we first became missionaries. To you all we express our deep and heartfelt appreciation, far beyond what our words can convey.

You will no doubt recall an oft-quoted cliché, that the Church here is a mile long but only an inch deep. Often, this seems to us to be an understatement. Reaching 'churched' people, helping them to grow in Christlikeness so that they can realize God's purposes for them, and be equipped to serve as He directs them, was the burden that our Lord laid on our hearts in 2007 as He prepared us to come here. Since our arrival, the validity of this objective has been reinforced to us time and again. Over the years, the Lord has brought us into contact with hundreds whom He has enabled us to help in their desire to know Him more fully. Outside of Harare, we would usually meet with them in groups in a variety of mostly very humble venues at dozens of different locations.

When the Covid pandemic first appeared in these parts in March 2020, we had to put a halt to travelling to our groups outside Harare and, since then, we have not been able to resume these trips mainly due to the deterioration of the roads, the rising cost of fuel, and inflation. But their spiritual needs have weighed heavily on our hearts, and we longed to meet them again in person. Once before, we met in Harare with several of them at a four-day retreat organized by us. About a month ago, Dhan woke up one morning having just dreamt of meeting with several of them at another such retreat. Later that morning, we received a phone message from the people who operated the venue where we had last met, saying that they had not heard from us for a while. Sensing that this was of the Lord, we began to pray about it and were convinced that it was indeed Him, and that we should host another retreat.

Consequently, we will be hosting a retreat from Sunday August 7th thru Wednesday August 10th-two of these days being national holidays. The theme is "we will in all things grow up into Him who is the head, that is, Christ" (Eph. 4:15). Already, we have some fourteen 'sleep-ins' from the rural areas and ten 'walk-in' participants from Harare and are now in the process of finalizing our preparations.

We are really excited about this event as are many of those who have already signed up. Our purpose in writing is not merely to give you an update but also to ask for your fervent prayers for the event. Obviously, the object is not merely meeting together but in meeting with the Lord. Here are some of the specific needs:

- Thanksgiving for this event and for each person who has already signed up; for the venue and the help we have received thus far;
- For prepared hearts the speaker, each participant and each helper;
- For the material and content to be shared, for certainty regarding the Lord's will in this.
- For good weather
- For safety and timely arrival for those travelling
- For a great move of the Spirit during the Retreat and for changed lives
- Any other matter that the Lord might bring to your mind as needing His provision/blessing.

Thanks so much for your continued partnership. May the Lord also meet your every need in Christ Jesus.

Last month, we wrote to you regarding the upcoming Discipleship Retreat. You prayed and the Lord blessed in so many ways. Some of you sent us brief emails and WhatsApp messages of encouragement and prayer support. However, following this recent retreat, and totally against cultural norms, there has been very insightful and fruitful discussions. So, we are extremely excited to report that the Holy Spirit is at work and that the 'retreat' is not over yet! Oh, how we praise the Lord for what is happening and pray for quality, lasting and abundant fruit from this event.

We thank God, too, for gifts of dressed chicken, freshly baked almond and cranberry biscotti, oat pecan and raisin crunchies, transportation to take the attendees to the venue from the city and vice versa at the end of the Retreat. Most of all, we thank God that you did not take lightly our requests for prayer. He certainly has answered and continues to honor your requests.
