When we first arrived in Zimbabwe almost fourteen years ago, we were totally convinced the Lord had sent us here to help believers grow in their relationship with the Lord. We set out doing this, first, in the capital city, Harare, and later in smaller cities. In each case, we met in groups with Pastors and Church leaders, teaching, discussing, encouraging. Since the onset of the Covid pandemic, however, we now rarely travel out of Harare. Instead, from our home, we meet online with individuals and groups weekly. Last week, we started a new in-person group. Our goal is the same as before – we grow, together and individually, to maturity in our relationship with the Lord. We also continue to meet with individuals at our home over morning coffee, afternoon tea or lunch for teaching and/or mutual encouragement in the faith.

Having had Covid, we were reflecting on the fact that one of the worst things persons recovering from it can do is to measure their recovery progress on a day-to-day basis as this often results in doubt, frustration and despair. The same is true of the work God has called us to - success can only be measured by the level of our faithfulness to God's call. The rest must be left to His Sovereign will.

However, we rejoice and give thanks to Him for those "Timothies" who over the past few months have called, emailed, or visited and expressed their thankfulness for how God has helped them through this ministry.

Sometimes, it seems difficult to believe that God is indeed working out His purposes as they apply to us. As the war in Ukraine escalates and Covid seems to be making a rebound, we must remind ourselves of who He is and who we are in Him; and find our rest in Him alone.

You might ask, 'Why is that so important?' Well, for one thing, much of the New Testament is taken up with this very attitude. For example, in the letter to the Hebrews, the writer repeatedly encourages the reader, "Let us go on". Secondly, we are convinced that the degree of our effectiveness and fruitfulness, individually and collectively, will be determined by the degree of our pursuit of a vibrant and dynamic relationship with the Lord. There is no other way to be able to cope with the increasingly trying times that are upon us or are yet to come.





Hard to believe we are halfway through 2022. Where has the time gone. I have been trying to stay in touch with our missionaries on the field and I don't always hear from them. I have asked each one of them to send me their inputs for this newsletter that you are reading right now. Only two of them have responded. I can only assume that the rest of them are all doing well.

Some good news is that Harvest has received almost \$4,000.00 in donations for Ukraine Relief. I have given \$2,000.00 of that to Randy Bullock to help with the Ukraine Relief in Romania. Randy's staff has been housing Ukraine Refuges for the last 2 months. The refuges spend from 10 days to 2 weeks in housing that has been made available by Romanian volunteers. They feed the family every day and once a week take food across the border into Ukraine. I am also working with Rev. Mike Deguzman, Lead Pastor of Community Bible Church here in Ocala. Pastor Mike has twin daughters that have been missionaries to Ukraine for almost 10 years. They are still in Ukraine. I have sent them \$1,000.00. I heard from Slavik and Alyona a few days ago. They have been in Romania for the last 2 months. They had to leave Odessa because it was very dangerous for them. I am also sending Slavik and Alyona some funds for the summer camps they are going to be doing in July for the Ukrainian Refuge Children that are in Romania.

Please continue to pray for me. God is doing a mighty work and is using Harvest in many other ways.

As Elaine and Lloyd face their later (increasing years they have noted that a number of friends and acquaintances are being 'taken home' one by one. This has made a growing number of widows and widowers. They have also been made aware of these older friends marrying each other, in these their later years. We rejoice with them, and like to see these remarriages of older friends, and wish them well, as we look forward to the day when we shall meet in our Father's home: free at last from the vicissitudes of our earthly sojourn and service: where they shall be "no marrying no giving in marriage."

While we regret seeing our elderly friends 'go home', the Scripture tells us that our heavenly Father wants 'to bring His beloved ones home.' "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord...that they may rest from their labors and their works do follow them." (Rev. 14:13)

Lloyd joined the company of 'Octogenerians' on May 27th. Our two daughters and their spouses/families – in Abu Dhabi and in North Carolina- attempted to surprise him (together with his four siblings here in Jamaica. Our younger daughter and her family from North Carolina made a trip to South Florida for a friend's son's wedding, and planned to come on down to Jamaica for a belated birth-day bash and a summer vacation, but had to drive right back home to North Carolina because of family problems. However, we in Jamaica did go on to the vacation cottage they had rented, and were able to make contact electronically and watch a streamed video and 'virtual' greetings sent to their father. We ate their food and benefitted from the family gathering, but greatly missed their physical presence and loving greetings. We got to thank God for the many decades of loving service to Him and the many mercies and gracious favors he has showered upon us as a family. Praises be to His great Name!!

However many additional years God shall grant us, will be spent for Him, and in gathering souls for His Kingdom.

Aiding the Wounded is a situation we find ourselves doing more and more as God brings needy family and neighbors to our notice. A number of them have had 'difficult times' emotionally, socially and/or psychologically. We have had to temporarily house, comfort and counsel two such young men in recent months. One is now housed at a government institution; another is still in an unresolved situation that requires your continual prayers. These situations have caused us much stress, physically and spiritually. Do continue to lift us and them up before our Lord in prayer often. Thanks!

While Elaine is deeply involved in ministries within her local church, including infrequent preaching assignments, she misses her former school-based visitation and youth counseling opportunities that, because of the Covid-19 schools shut-down over the past two years. The recent re-opening of face-to-face classes throughout the educational system may provide new opportunities. Pray with her that may come about soon.

Lloyd's Writing Projects: Lloyd can't seem to relax and just "enjoy life" in semi-retirement, like Elaine would like him to do. He is now involved in two research and writing projects: (1) Finishing up and

preparing this for printing: the centennial history of his denominational fellowship of churches/assemblies. This he is co-writing. He has reached the stage where he is inputting photos, etc. The publication costs still mystify us: it is a hurdle we find difficult to cross. Please ask the Lord to provide a sponsor/sponsors as we approach those we think will help finance printing costs, soon. (2) He has recently been co-opted to assist his former denomination: the Anglicans/Episcopalian Church of Jamaica, to write the double-centennial history since the first Bishop was assigned to Jamaica in 1824. This was during slavery times, just before Abolition of the system of slavery. Bishops formerly would lead the church from London, through the local Governor and the political Assembly, made up of slave-owners.

My part is to reprise the record I did in my first book, of that church's role in preparing and sending the sons of former slaves as missionaries to certain African and Latin American countries during the late 18th and early 19th centuries. I also want to highlight the church's creditable work in winning the slaves to faith in Christ, and continue to do so through special evangelism efforts and agencies, up to the present. We ask for your assisting prayers that the Lord would give Lloyd guidance, favor and information to accomplish these history-writing tasks.

Elaine and I want to, once again, express our gratitude to each of you for your years of faithful prayers for us and your financial gifts which have enabled us to serve nearly fifty (50) years of missionary service, abroad, and now back home.







It's hard to believe that this is the end of the third quarter of 2022. I have been so busy that I have lost track of time. I am grateful to the Lord for good health to keep everything going. Thank you, Jesus.

As this quarter ends, I am working hard at trying to provide relief to several countries. First to Haiti. Pray for peace in Haiti so that the container of food that is sitting in port can be delivered. Second to Puerto Rico. Hurricane Fiona caused server damage to the Island. They have no drinking water or electricity. Third is the Dominican Republic. They are also dealing with the results of Hurricane Fiona. What all this information means is that the Fourth Quarter is going to start off with at least three containers being shipped. Praise the Lord.

I want to share a testimony on how the Lord provided some funds for our folks in Gonaives, Haiti. A couple of Sunday's ago one of the people that support Harvest handed me two of the "return envelopes" that I send with each letter that we mail. I told him "They are empty. I send them to you so you can put something in them." We both chuckled because I know that he supports Harvest via online giving. There was another member of the church standing next to me, so I turned to him and handed him one of the empty envelopes and told him "Here, fill this."

On Monday morning this friend stopped by Harvest office at 7:30a.m. and handed me the envelope and said "Here it is. I filled it just like you asked me." We both chuckled and I said "Thank you brother" and he left. I didn't look at the envelope for a few hours and I was SHOCKED when I did. In the envelope there was 10 (TEN) \$100.00 bills. This young man had just donated \$1,000.00.

It just so happened that I received an URGENT message from Pastor Charlie from Gonaives and here is what he said. "Bishop I am really in trouble, I need some help I cannot feed the kids. The city of Gonaives is locked. To survive you need God and some money. The people cannot make it anymore. The images that I sent are about the people of who invaded the WORLD FOOD PROGRAM DEPOT AND TAKE EVERYTHING BECAUSE THEY ARE HUNGRY. THERE IS NO WAY TO EXPLAIN YOU WHAT WE ARE FACING. A PROBLEM OF INSECURITY, DRINK WATER, THE PRICE OF EVERYTHING IS HIGHER AND WE ARE FACING IT EVERY DAY. They attacked many catholic schools and they took everything the police force cannot stop them from doing.... That happened in Gonaives Thursday and yesterday. THE CITY OF PORT AU PRINCE IS WORSE..Tell your people that we need prayer in Gonaives..."

It was as clear as can be what I needed to do with the funds that I had just received. On Tuesday I sent Pastor Charlie the \$1,000.00 that I had just received the day before. Praise the Lord. Since that time, I have received another gift that I will be sending very soon. I am glad that I can share how the Lord provided help for out people in Gonaives, Haiti.

We invite them to have their loved ones to facetime with us to make sure we prepare the meal correctly. We also want to have the students' family comfortable with their child being around our family.

In the few months we previously spent in Hungary we had the pleasure of hosting dozens of students from: India, Iran, Germany, Russia, Nigeria, Azerbaijan, US, and Hungary. They were all looking forward to continuing to meet.

We will offer the new student friends a free course in English as a second language. The introductory course is John's Gospel with the advanced course being, Mere Christianity By C. S. Lewis. We will have events in and around Budapest the students will be invited to be involved in to build cross cultural deep relationships.

We do street ministry and serve in various ways with each of these ministries. They are trustworthy ministries that a young Christian would grow in their faith while participating with our group.

We intend to have a young couple join us who already have residence. Being established in Budapest with residence permits is huge and overcomes a year of cultural adjustments that often never make it. Our goal is to have them free us up to add universities as our time enables. Their initial roles would be to handle the communications, scheduling of activities, and teach the English as a Second Language course. As soon as a student becomes a Believer they will be discipled using the same tools that we used to bring them to Christ. ### Serving the Lord in Jamaica



God has promised multiple times in His Word, that He will 'never leave you nor forsake you.' Even our increasingly graying hairs is said in Scripture will be 'flourishing', as God continues to help us, and cause us to bring Him glory.

About a month ago Lloyd began to feel a great lack/loss of energy, and some pain in the rear of his left pelvic area. The left leg doesn't respond as strongly as before: he is almost dragging the leg as he walks. His daily walking distance has had to be reduced. A visit to his doctor had him being sent to do Blood work and an MRI.

The results of the blood work was generally good, but the MRI results indicate possible bone problems (the possible condition of 'Pagets' disease was mentioned) He was referred to an Osteopathic physician, who referred him to a Physiotherapist. Lloyd has done one session and is due to return in a few days for a second. We are taking all this in stride, and trusting God to guide us as to the future.

His dental work is another factor, as his daughters have arranged for implants to be done to replace his dentures. A number of visits to his Dental Surgeon (a nephew of his) has brought him near to the end of the process. But it has been excruciatingly difficult, with great difficulty in chewing: particularly cutting of meats. His weight has never been great, and now he has lost a few pounds. We still hope he will lose his hesitation to go to the dinner table, and will recover the lost weight. His visits to his Urologist are now only twice annually, to keep check after doing prostate surgery a couple years ago. His PSA tests are good, thank God. Do pray with us about these issues, please!

Elaine is doing well, just trying to keep down her cholesterol, and slightly elevated blood-pressure. She keeps in touch with her cardiologist about occasional heart palpitations. But,, after some yard work, sweeping and raking of leaves, she usually is better.

Weather Conditions: This is hurricane season, but so far no storms or hurricanes have threatened. But the rainy season is upon us: lightning strikes have been shutting down our Wi-Fi reception, so we have been without emails or Facebook for half-week. Out T.V. got blown, so we have had to buy a new one, a flat screen 'Smart T.V.' But we are not smart enough to set it up properly enough to get our usual channels. So our Cable service will send out a technician to get it properly working tomorrow. We have missed our important News and Religious stations for many days. It feels like 'dark days' cut off from the world of news and communication.

Ministry Activities have been reduced, but with Covid-19 shut-downs now over we are making adjustments. Lloyd is no longer lecturing at either his alma mater (Bible College) or the Graduate School of Theology in Kingston. He does not like teaching virtually (by Zoom), but prefers face to face teaching. He is now mostly devoted to writing projects, along with his preaching on Missions at his local church. Keeping in touch with the missionaries, regular home prayer times for them, and financially supporting a few of them (particularly the Jamaicans who are weakly supported financially) keeps us involved. He is trying to finish up the Centenary history of his denomination, which he is co-writing with another,

in order to send it to a publisher and having it printed. In addition, he was co-opted to help in writing the two hundred year history of the Church of England in Jamaica (Anglican), since it first became a Diocese (a See) in 1834. He has been asked to reprise the report he did in his first book, on the sending of Jamaican Missionaries to Africa and to some Central and South American countries after the Abolition of Slavery in the British Empire, iof which we were a Colony. (We are currently joining in official mourning for the late Queen Elizabeth II. She was a person of evident faith in Christ, as well as a confidant of the late evangelist Billy Graham. We are praying for the new King and the grieving family, and praying that the United Kingdom will see a revival of effectual spiritual life.

Elaine: continues actively as a Lay-Preacher with the Methodist Church, but has asked to be used sparingly so that she may go back to some of the Youth involvements she had before the Covid-19 shut down. These include getting back into schools with her 'Wait & Win' program: proclaiming the wisdom of delaying sexual involvement until Marriage and allowing the Lord to transform them by putting their faith in Him, and developing strong moral and spiritual standards. She would also like to go back to the government Literacy agency youth, bring them into the Church Hall to have members instruct them in various educational and practical skills they can use in the future. She would also like to get back to having Children's Evangelistic Clubs in the churches of the Circuit. These are ministries that fill her with a sense of purpose and usefulness.

Family: Lloyd's daughter was here from Raleigh North Carolina two weeks ago, and we visited with her a couple of days in Montego Bay. She is working on Jamaican Citizenship, so that her son can respond to requests for him to possibly represent Jamaica in Greco-Roman wrestling. He has won a number of High-School and State competitions. Do continue to pray with us also for a nephew of Lloyd's who has psychological problems and resists institutional care. He is finally in such care, but is not fully submitting to the process. He also needs spiritual maturity, to grow well in his new faith experience. Pray!

Like you, we are concerned, often scared at the many world situation that cause wars and fears. We pray that peoples' hearts would turn to the Lord for HOPE. This seems to becoming a time of FEARS and much lack of reason to HOPE. People need the Lord, and we want to do all we can to point them to god and salvation through His loving Son. May each one of us, and you, make this a priority in these seemingly 'Last Days'.

We rejoice in the knowledge that God is in charge of world affairs, and He is not being taken by surprise by any happening. Remember that His Word tells us that "When you see these things beginning to come to pass, lift us your head and look up for your redemption draws near." (Luke 21:28)

We rejoice for your faithful support and prayers. Your partnership is vital to our service for Christ. We pray also for you and yours.

## Haitian Center for Inclusive Education with Dr. Don DeVito

### Serving the Lord in Haiti



Dear Faithful Friends,

The situation at the Haitian Center for Inclusive Education is one of desperation. Gertrude Bien Aime has been dealing with the out of control gang situation in Haiti to try to bring food, supplies and gasoline to the Notre Maison Orphanage for children with disabilities and the Haitian Center for Inclusive Education. Gertrude says the gangs kill anyone anytime whether they are middle class or poor. Right now food is a luxury here. Things are not good and she is trying to keep the children with disabilities fed.

There are 150 children including those at Notre Maison Orphanage with special needs who want to start school at her Haitian Center for Inclusive Education, but have no funds to support the teachers or running of the school. Last June they actually tried to give the children their exams in between the gang riots. Gertrude says the gangs came close to the orphanage and so many of their neighbors ran away. She can't run because of the children. She said the police were able to control them that time.

Our goal is to get the children at the Orphanage funds for the food that is available and funds to pay the teachers, many of whom are willing to continue to provide instruction. With the economy in its current situation any registration local families would contribute to run the school is not a possibility. This is the largest inclusion program in Haiti and we are asking for your help to get Gertrude and the children through this difficult time.

There are many lessons to be learnt from nature, one of them being the seasons. Wherever we are, seasons exist. In some countries, the seasons are more distinct than in others, but they are still there.

Here in Zimbabwe, all of Africa is north of us except South Africa. We have only two distinct seasons, the dry season, winter and the rainy season or summer. Winter, around May to August, can be quite cold. White potatoes and wheat prevail then but must be irrigated. During the summer, the Country receives most of its rainfall supplied mostly by the Indian Ocean cyclones. Some crops, for example maize, soya, sorghum, and tobacco are grown in the summer. It is not unusual for the rains to be minimal or delayed. Sometimes, there can also be quite a lapse between the changing seasons often resulting in drought.

Another feature here is the changing landscape. Every season brings with it a variety of flowering trees and shrubs. For example, as winter fades, a local shade tree, the msasa, drops all its leaves (some call it Fall) and almost immediately begins to sprout new leaves in various hues of red/orange/rust/tan etc. This lasts but a few days until it is replaced by new leaves in tender shades of green. The blue/purple jacaranda appears before long and sheds its flowers on the street, sidewalk, or yard beneath. What sights to behold!

Isn't natural life like that too? Every stage has its own distinctive features – turning, creeping, walking, teething, growing into adulthood, getting into midlife, becoming seniors, and so on. Some phases are characterized by the need for help, others by an independent streak. But they all go to make up a life.

So too is spiritual life. We may recall our beginning often marked by uncertainty, sometimes doubt, and our need for reassurance. Then we embarked on what is usually called the Christian life – participation in a local church and its activities, self-confidence, busyness, perhaps years in some form of well-intentioned ministry. It is then we might begin to sense a shallowness in our relationship with the Lord and might ask ourselves: 'Is this all?', 'Have I been on the right track?', 'Has it been worthwhile?'. Then perhaps fear that we had been walking in only the shadow of something far more real and greater than we had experienced grips us as we contemplate the approaching dim light of the evening of our days here on earth.

In the Lord's grace, we begin to see our Lord Jesus Christ as the Reality of our salvation and wish we had more time to explore the depth of His riches which, sadly, were missed during most of our Christian life. We read again Colossians 2:9, 10 from the New Living Translation – "For in Christ lives all the fullness of God in a human body. So, you are complete through your union with Christ...." Other passages of Scripture lead us to conclude, 'Yes, that's what it's about ...... Christ!', for "He is the sum of all things"; and the kind of Christians we are and the measure of His fullness in us will be determined exclusively by our knowledge of Him. As we contemplate further, perhaps we reflect on how we might be eulogized by our loved ones and we fear they might just present a brighter picture of our walk with the Lord than it really was.



I was invited by Sharath (Pastor I stay with in India) to go on a mission trip in South Sudan and Uganda (Middle of Africa) for a month from June – July 2022. Sharath knew a lady named Lucy Bona who lived in Texas who was putting a meeting together in South Sudan and Uganda.

Four people from the United States (Lucy and Jivel from Texas, Rosemary from Kansas, Ray from Florida and Sharath from India. Lucy knew some people in Aweil, South Sudan who helped with the organization.

80,000 people showed up for the first spiritual meeting of its kind for four days. Many people walked for days to attend the meetings. Our response to the calls for Salvation and Healings were huge (in the 1,000's). Then on Sunday each of us preached in a different Churches. My Church service had seven people healed and one person Born Again.

Lucy and Rosemary were both born in Juba, South Sudan and could speak the local language. As we met with Lucy's huge family (some she hadn't seen in 30 years) everyone, except us, was talking the local language, we just sat and listened. Lucy had a huge family and everywhere we went we met more of her family. She also met with local leaders.

When we were finished in Juba, Rosemary and Sharath went home. That left Lucy, Jivel and me to fly to Uganda. When we arrived in Uganda it was much nicer then in South Sudan. We spent a week at an orphanage that Lucy had supported. We baptized 21 people and fellowshipped with them for a week.

Sharath is now in Texas and will meet me in Atlanta, Ga. on October 14, 2022 to fly to India for nine months. I am really excited about spending nine months in India.

As of right now I need to buy my return ticket from India as well as money to live on. Thank you for your ongoing support. Pray for us and support my mission as the Lord leads.











# Storybook Pediatrics with Ron & Stacy Smith Serving the Lord in Haiti



There is a lot of news from our missions corner. You may remember that Stacy and I got the Make A Difference Worldwide Institute started in Onaville above Port-au-Prince, Haiti after our three-month stay in 2018. Since then the school is doing well. Our mission partner, Simi (Joseph Similien) graduated over a hundred the end of 2021 and another thirty-six in just the past few weeks.

The school primarily teaches English which is vital for those speaking only Haitian Creole. He has two and a half years of formal ESL training with the Haitian American Institute and is well qualified. All five levels of English only costs \$200 per student. We welcome scholarship donations for this rather than humanitarian financial aid.

Simi lost his young wife, Martine, suddenly and unexpectedly from a hemorrhagic stroke earlier this year. He and their seven-year-old son Jachim are soldiering on with the ministry. We have been unable to return to Haiti since the gangs have taken over most every street corner. Our plans to eventually get the Malnutrition Study Clinic to prevent Severe Acute Malnutrition in the children in Haiti have since been on hold.

I returned from a medical mission trip in June with MedReach, Inc out of Alabama. Our group camped about 8-12 hours back in the bush for two weeks and we four providers saw over 2,600 patients in two villages over two weeks. Many accepted Christ. Stacy just recently came back from a two-day mission trip with Indian Ministries of North America to a reservation in Conehatta, Mississippi.

About eight weeks ago, I was voted in as chairman of the missions committee here at our church. The House of Prayer supports some 50 missionaries around the world. More exciting though are the churches first three home-grown couples going to far distant mission fields abroad. I've never attended a true sending church. There is a distinct difference between a mission-minded church and one that goes on to also be a sending church.

God bless you, Merry Christmas, and a Happy New Year!



## Haitian Center for Inclusive Education with Dr. $Don\ DeVito$

### Serving the Lord in Haiti



Wonderful blessings and opportunities to support the Notre Maison Orphanage for Children with Disabilities and the Haitian Center for Inclusive Education in Port-au-Prince.

Gertrude Bien Aime was awarded the Landis Stetler Award for leadership in special education this past October at the state special education teachers' conference in Daytona Beach, Florida. This is the highest honor in leadership you can receive in Florida for the field of special education. Gertrude had to navigate blockades from the gangs in Haiti and through support from an organization called SEMPRE, the Society for Education, Music, Philosophy and Research received the travel funds necessary to attend and speak at the conference to special education professionals throughout the state of Florida. Gertrude is the epitome of the leadership and dedication that signifies the Landis Stetler Award.

#### A background on the Notre Maison Orphanage for children with disabilities, Gertrude Bien Aime.

Gertrude founded and maintains the care and education of 40 children with disabilities at the Notre Maison Orphanage in Portau-Prince, Haiti. Rescuing many of them from the streets, she began by arranging a special education teacher to assist her in the orphanage and through collaboration and education training that would be highlighted in CEC's 100th anniversary 100 teachers presentation for Harvest Internationals Dr. Donald DeVito, she networked with the Council for Exceptional Children, universities, K-12 programs in the US and other organizations to provide training and resources in the Haitian Center for Inclusive Education which she imagined and founded. This was published in the Oxford Handbook of Social Media and Music Learning. Her collaborations with CEC members to provide training to the Haitian teachers she hired and arranged the funds in Port-au-Prince to pay (a feat that is unbelievable considering the challenges in Haiti through gangs, the government instability, earthquakes and storms that stood in her way but left her undaunted and successful.) These training collaborations in Port-au-Prince by US teachers was highlighted in a chapter in the Handbook of Arts Education and Special Education published by CEC members Dr. Jean Crockett and Sharon Malley.

#### How you can help:

The situation in Port-au-Prince for the orphanage and the HCIE inclusion school is dire. Purchasing gas to run the generators in the orphanage is controlled by the gangs and is critical for sustenance. Gertrude has to struggle to purchase beans or rice for the children to eat due to the blockading of ports. If you could be willing to provide support to Gertrude's Notre Maison Orphanage (see Harvest International's "The Love we Breath" or Harvest's link for "The Haitian Center for Inclusive Education", any assistance would go a long way to helping continue education and resources for children with disabilities in Haiti. Part of Gertrude's participation in the conference resulted in meeting vendors of technology and assistive materials for children with disabilities. Any donation would also go toward bringing these accommodated learning materials to the orphanage and school.



We greet you with JOY as we celebrate the advent of our Lord Jesus Christ! God has been gracious to us and answered prayers for which we asked last month. My mother recovered beautifully from her surgery, and is very nearly back to her usual self. We are grateful we have been here to assist while she has been recovering.

Western Union had put sanctions against Haiti, blocking us from sending much needed money to our people there. At the same time, food wasn't coming up the mountain due to violent road blocks and a fuel shortage. Trouble makers from another town came into our market place and looted the main section, resulting in market being closed. All these things added up to make very tough times. Food was getting scarce and people were scared and weary of everything. Praise God, we have seen him caring for His people in Pecry and the surrounding area. Western Union lifted the sanctions, allowing us and many others to send much needed money. The gangs came to some agreement with the police officials, allowing some gas to be purchased and in turn, food trucks to come up the mountain. Food is still very pricy, but available.

Though we have wanted to build another home, the greatest need in our village is food. After much prayer and anxiety as to how to provide food for the people we love, Austin decided on a work program. He is employing a group of men to clear rock off of our land. The rock can be used to improve the roads in Pecry and the men working will have money to provide for their families. Thank our Father in Heaven, who has given us good neighbors who need the work and are happy to earn it rather than beg for handouts.

Last month, Manna Packs (emergency family food packages) came available for us to receive. We requested 19 boxes, (about 600 pounds) and paid for them to be shipped. The food was gratefully received by our friends in Port-Au-Prince. Thank you for giving; your generosity brought life and hope to God's people who are trapped in Port-Au-Prince.

The ambulance continues to be a blessing in our community. Gilbert has taken quite a few injured motor-cyclists. Last week he took both men that wrecked each other's bikes. Your giving continues to pay for gas and maintenance for the vehicle.

Austin and I need your prayers for wisdom, as always. We are taking it one day at a time, but our hearts burn to return to our home and the people we love in Pecry, Haiti. Our plan to return as a family in January has proved fruitless. Austin was able to obtain tickets for himself for a short trip. We have flights booked for the whole family at the end of March. That feels far away, but we cannot work against God, though we sometimes try I am afraid! Please pray that if God wills, Austin will be able to take the trip in January, to scope out the situation and encourage our friends there.

We thank God for each of you, and praise Him that he has entrusted this work to us. May this Christmas season draw your hearts towards the Father's, as you celebrate the birth or our blessed Lord and eagerly await his return!
