During our last trip to Haiti we had the opportunity to visit Notre Maison, an orphanage that houses over 40 severely handicapped children in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. While visiting with the children and workers we noticed that the orphange is in need of some updating. We returned home with a deep desire to help improve the living conditions of the children.

Shiloh Children's Home and Harvest International, Inc. are partnering with Notre Maison Orphanage to send a 40' container filled with pallets of food, new and used appliances, clothes, hygiene products and medical supplies. The goal is to raise \$10,000 to help with the purchase of a 40' Seaworthy Certified steel container, pay for Inland/Ocean freight from Ocala, FL to Port-au-Prince, Haiti, duty on the container and Inland freight from the port at Port-au-Prince to the orphanage.
