With Danny retired, the costs of sending sea containers skyrocketing and all Harvest staff working remotely, we found that it was no longer necessary for Harvest to own such a large building. Thank the Lord, the building sold very quickly and without problems, so now we are able to reduce the overhead that Harvest had significantly.

As such, we are now reducing our missionary fees to 5%! This means that every donation that comes into Harvest will have only 5% deducted for administrative fees and 95% will go directly to missionary support.

Thank you for your support and prayers for Harvest and our missionaries this year. For us, we encountered numerous roadblocks as we took steps towards beginning a new project in the Dominican Republic, so after much prayer, we withdrew from the plan to purchase land in the D.R. and again we are waiting on the Lord and seeking His direction for further ministry for Harvest.





Why are lights such an important part of Christmas? They seem to be a necessary part of celebrating Christmas – at home, in offices or other places of business and even in public squares. Many interrupt their schedules to stop and admire and comment on them and compare them to other displays. And this happens year after year. Have we ever wondered why this is so? What is the significance of these lights?

We believe the Bible helps us arrive at a conclusion. When Christ came onto Earth as a human being, the world was covered by darkness and gloom characterized largely by instability among the nations. They would sooner consult the ungodly than God. Against this background, Isaiah was called by God to be His prophet. He testified that the Lord's strong hand was upon him, warning him not to follow the way of the people by fearing what they feared. He was to fear the Lord only and He, the Lord, would be Isaiah's and Israel's and Judah's hiding place (Is. 8). Yet, again, the Lord warned him, saying, "When men tell you to consult mediums and spiritists, should not a people inquire of their God?" All of this pointed to the abysmal failure of the Lord's people to trust Him alone, especially during difficult times, rather than resort to the occult – a sure indication of the depths to which they had fallen.

Such was the darkness of that time, and it is against this backdrop that Isaiah received this word from the Lord: "Nevertheless, there will be no more gloom for those who were in distress. In the past, He humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Napthali, but in the future He will honor Galilee of the Gentiles, by the way of the sea, along the Jordan – The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned... For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be upon his shoulders, and he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Is. 9:1,2,6).

We hear the harmonious voices of the choirs: "And He shall reign forever and ever. Alleluia! Alleluia!!" And we shiver, not because we have the "Christmas spirit" as some would suggest, but because this is the ultimate chorus of those who know the Lord, a song of victory of good over evil, of light over darkness, of grace over law. Our Lord said, "I am the light of the world". The man born blind (John 9) not only received his sight when he believed, but when the Light came and he realized that it was the Lord Himself who had healed him, He worshipped our Savior. May we not forget to worship Him too. "Rejoice, for the Light has come!"

Darkness continues to saturate this world. Men invent new, 'improved' and more expensive ways of doing evil, using every means at their disposal to ensure that evil predominates. When will it end, we His children ask? It ends when the Lord Jesus says, "Enough is enough!" It is His timetable that matters; His will that prevails.

So, His children walk by faith and not by sight. We tolerate but do not promote or participate in the darkness, resisting its every attempt to enslave us. And we trust the Lord who uses even the pain, sorrow and, many negative things that we all often experience to accomplish His Divine purposes for us and often, beyond. This is our motivation; it is what fuels our zeal and encourages us to keep our eyes on Him. In the process, we learn to trust Him, day by day, moment by moment until He comes; and we appreciate His grace even more. We are very privileged to have come to know the Lord and we are learning to trust Him and to follow His leading both in our personal lives and in ministry.

Thank you, dear Friends, for being a part of the ministry in which we and others are engaged. This, too, is a great privilege. Know that we deeply appreciate your prayers, gifts, and words of encouragement. These are some aspects of the gift of your fellowship with us and, together, with the Lord. Despite the darkness, may the Light of His presence envelop you and yours this Christmas and always. Much love. Rejoice for the Light Has Come!

Greetings in the name of God our Father and the Lord, Jesus Christ!

We are so grateful to be in the Advent of our Lord Jesus, and to Celebrate his first coming and the anticipation of his second coming. This has been a truly wonderful time of anticipation, and reflection for our family and we hope that your hearts are one with ours in this great celebration!

Unfortunately, our neighbors in Pecry have had a very difficult fall. Abundant rains fell to plant, but just as the harvest was ready to be gathered rain came again. Some people brought in their beans, hoping to have enough sunshine to dry them in their yards and others left the beans in the fields, hoping the fresh air would help dry the vines. All methods were futile; everyone's beans sprouted in the pods and are rotting. With over a month of straight rain, this weather is unprecedented. Many homes sustained damage from the prolonged damp conditions (traditional homes being built of mud and rock with a small amount of cement for plaster) and it's yet to be seen how the loss of the bean crop will affect our village and surrounding areas. Most people depend on the crop for daily food and a portion of it for re-planting, so with a complete loss for everyone in the area, it's sure to have pretty negative effects for the coming year.

In light of this, we have chosen a family for the next home-build in our village of Pecry. Their home's wall and foundation were slowly eroded over the month of heavy rain. The crew has been unable to start any preparations as of yet due to the road conditions and the rain. Please pray for God's mercy for his people in Pecry. Many are suffering the same situation. We would like to build two homes, but await the end of year's report to know how much we will have available.

Austin is planning his trip to our village in January. Please pray regarding his travel plans. The airports are still closed in some areas, but the North West is open. We hope he will not have to ride a motorcycle again, but if that is God's will, please pray for his safety.

Several serious prayer requests for friends of ours:

- Madam Orenus had something like a stroke and is left mostly paralyzed. Please pray for God's grace on her and her family.
- Wilgens (our main mechanic and long-time friend) having kidney and prostate problems. His
 family is dependent on his income. Please pray for grace, provision and appropriate medical assistance.

Thank you so much for your faithful and generous support of our work in Haiti. Your compassion is commendable and has enabled us to extend the love and grace of Christ to SO many families this year. Please pray for an awakening of the Church in Haiti, as only God's light come overcome the deepening darkness there. May Christ shine on you! He is our Hope!
